Seminar Description

This online seminar provides an introduction to a comprehensive, exemplary practice of assessment-intervention for infants and toddlers that address the complex nature of self regulation. This seminar includes an overview of the development of the SELF Model of Regulation, which focuses on underlying factors that impact development such as self-regulation, sensory processing and temperament. The SELF Process provides a framework for understanding these factors in five domains: neurophysiological, behavioral, emotional, social-communicative and environmental. The emphasis of the seminar will be on learning the assessment process and understanding how to provide useful information to families regarding their children's daily care routines and behavior. The SELF Process provides strategies for changing interaction patterns and styles, and adapting environments to help children better regulate their behavior.

Seminar Facilitators:

Dr. Holly Harrison and Dr. Jane Clarke are the authors of the SELF A-I Process. They have spent the last 15 years developing models, providing training and technical assistance, and working on system changes in the field of early intervention
